Erin Pigneri and Shawn Lyons of Uncle Ernie's Bayfront Grill & Brewhouse generously donated to the Friends of the Governor Stone a percentage of their proceeds for May 31st. The vessel was available for tours at the dock of this popular St. Andrews restaurant and drew quite a crowd.

An Eventful Ft. Walton Beach Stay

The *Governor Stone* docked at the Fort Walton Beach Landing from June 1 to July 29 this year. Volunteers were on board each Sunday, Monday, and Friday from 5 to 7 pm and over 400 people visited for tours.

The vessel defended the City against notorious pirate Captain Billy Bowlegs during the Festival June 3 and 4, provided a hands-on block and tackle activity for the City-sponsored Kids Day in the Park June 24th, taught schooner and sailing lore to the Archaeology Summer Campers from Heritage Park and offered the public a view of the July 4th fireworks over her bowsprit. On July 24th the FWB Sail and Power Squadron held a rendezvous at the *Governor Stone* and the Woodmen of the World presented an American flag to Captain Gercak to be flown on the vessel. The FWB Police Honor Guard escorted the flag to the vessel where it was raised on a halyard and honored with the Pledge of Allegiance.

will be open for tours Tuesday and Thursday evenings 5-7 pm. Check the website or call for current schedule, as she will be sailing and participating in events as well.

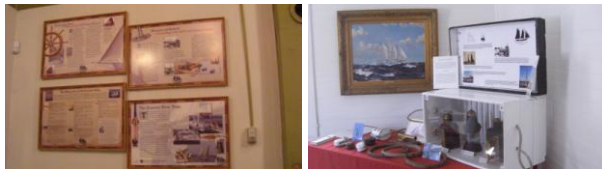
Wreath Laying

Saturday morning, August 27th at 9:00 the *Governor Stone* will lead a flotilla from Panama City Marina to near Lake Caroline where memorial wreaths will be laid. Co-sponsor St. Andrews Presbyterian Church will lay a wreath in honor of the heritage of the church, 125 years old this year. A wreath honoring those lost on 9/11 will be laid by City Commissioner Mike Nichols. Private vessels are welcome to join the flotilla and all are invited to ride the St. Andrew Bay Ferry on the trip which concludes at St. Andrews Marina. Call 850-615-1477 to reserve. Half the \$10 fee will be donated to the Governor Stone.

Displays

The Friends have two displays about the *Governor Stone* and the role of coastal schooners along the upper Gulf coast. Four panels describe the history of the *GS* and the socio-economic impact of vessel like her. A collection of *GS* artifacts, photos and memorabilia is displayed from two of the vessel deck boxes. Either is a stand-alone display, or they can be used together. Museums, libraries, etc. are invited to use these educational resources.
