July 17 -48
Left canal at 6:10 am
Anchored at 1st Key 7:35 am
Fishing. Caught 130 white trout, speckled trout, & ground mullet
Back in @ 1:45 pm

June 4 1949

Weather Fair

Left dock 7am for Horse Shoe Keys 7:35am anchored. Bad points Perry went shore with Lucius in small out Board to get fresh Battery returned at 10am USMM promised to send Help if not started by 10:30 am 10:05am underway anchored at Horshoe Key 10:45am Fished. Left Key at 4:05 pm Docked 5:15pm

Took Distributor out to Hammet Motors Inc & had same synconized coil & condenser checked installed new points.
